

PLANE MAKING TOOL LIST

- Low angle **block plane**, preferably 1 $\frac{3}{8}$ ". It's worth spending money on these; avoid the new Stanley #60- $\frac{1}{2}$ and Record of any vintage. Stanley Sweethearts are adequate.
 - Dovetail saw (Western or Japanese)
 - Set of chisels $\frac{1}{8}$ " to 1" or wider
 - Straight blade screwdriver:
 $\frac{5}{16}$ " stubby for tightening cap iron screws
(Craftsman #00941586000 optional)
 - Sharpening stones, either:
Oil stones: India, soft Arkansas or Washita, and hard Arkansas; or
Water stones: 800 & 1200 grit and 6000 (King "S") or equivalent
 - Files: 4" mill smooth, 6-8" mill bastard, and an inexpensive set of needle files
 - Safety glasses or goggles
 - Hearing protectors (w/o stereo)
 - The Fine Art of Cabinetmaking* by James Krenov
 - Rule or tape measure
 - 6" engineers square
 - 6–10 oz. hammer (plane iron adjustment)
 - Glue bottle
 - Bench brush
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The above items are required, those below are suggested:

- 6" – 8" hand clamps
- Small auxiliary bench vise
- Coffee mug of sufficient quality to resist high-test corrosion
- Dust mask
- Anti-fatigue mat
